In the spirit of improvement, let me share the bugfixes & improvements we have recently released:

Glossary headaches no more

We had a bug where new [glossary](#) definitions were not indented on the Glossary page, and the older ones were. This inconsistency in formatting has now been resolved, and your Glossary should look as lovely as ever:



There was an issue occurring when folks tried to turn off or on the link to their [Glossary within their Table of Contents](#). The update [off or on] would not be visible without first busting the cache! This has been fixed, so now you should see [or not see] your Glossary within your table of contents immediately after changing that setting.

Snippet rendering optimization

One of our beloved customers had a massive article that took ages to load. We jumped in to try to help them with this. In the process, we ended up doing a massive optimization of how quickly [snippets](#) will be rendered in KnowledgeOwl. If you have articles that are using a lot of Snippets, you should see them being much zippiier than before.

Owl Analytics now lets you track AI agents as referrers

We've made a recent improvement to [Owl Analytics](#) that lets you track AI agents as referrer types. You can see these details within reports that include referrers, like the [Transitions report](#) and the [Logs report](#).
